MEMBERSHIP FEES AND TRAINING FEES

Membership in the Twin Ports Dog Training Club is available to any person interested in our dog training activities. The Club year is from January 1st through December 31st. Membership dues are payable by members in January and by new members when joining the club. Dues are \$20.00 per year, \$5.00 late fee if not paid by January 31.

Training Fees:

Per 8 week session: BEGINNERS CLASS \$120.00
(\$5 discount after attendance in Puppy Class)
ADVANCED OBEDIENCE \$90.00
PUPPY CLASS \$60.00
CONFORMATION \$60.00

Pay By Night: \$15.00

All fees are payable at the beginning of each session. Dogs to be advanced through the classes in accordance with our Advanced Training Testing Program (See below).

Special Training Privilege fee (STP) – The STP is available anyone meeting the requirements. The fee is \$100.00 for the current calendar year. To be eligible for the STP the handler must have trained previously with this Club in at least two full sessions, passed an Intermediate Test and be a member in good standing. Once eligible, an individual may train additional dogs in any class (except Beginners or Puppy) under the STP for an additional fee of \$75.00 per dog for the calendar year. The additional dog(s) must be owned or co-owned by the individual or by a member of his/her immediate family.

The STP is NOT transferable and there are NO refunds or holdovers on fees. There is no class fee if the dog has earned their Utility title.

ADVANCED TRAINING TESTING PROGRAM

BEGINNERS CLASS: Dogs in their first training session. No graduation requirements – automatic advancement to next class on approval of the Director of Training.

NOVICE CLASS: To graduate from Novice, dog and handler must pass a licensed novice test, or the equivalent, with a qualifying score.

OPEN CLASS: To graduate from Open, dog and handler must pass a licensed Open test or the equivalent with a qualifying score.

UTILITY CLASS: To graduate from Utility, dog and handler must pass a licensed Utility test or the equivalent with a qualifying score.

Tests are given at the conclusion of each training session or at the discretion of the Director of Training.
